- Build your network and create new opportunities

Who can apply?

Applications for funding are open to residents of Australia who are aged 18 and over.

Applicants can apply for more than one Award category but a separate application must be submitted for each. Applicants will only be eligible to receive one Award for their project. The relevant judging panels will be advised if an applicant has applied in other categories.

Your Project

In order to apply for an Award, applicants must have an initiative or project they would like to complete.

This may include, but is not limited to, projects about:

- Leadership on key issues
- Innovative, scientific or technological developments in your industry

- Health and wellbeing of animals
- Improvements in packaging, distribution or marketing of Industry products
- Education or training programs that enhance the skills of people in the industry or improve awareness of the industry
- The practical application of studies on agricultural topics.

Applicants are expected to complete their project within 12 months of receiving an Award and will be required to submit a presentation to SFPQ detailing the activities and results from implementing their project proposal.

How to Apply?

Applications must include a completed and signed application form, along with a written report that outlines your initiative.

Where to from here?

Nominations open on 2 April 2012 and close on 8 June 2012.

The successful recipients will be notified in writing and announced at a formal presentation on 12 July 2012.

Who will make the decision?

The decision will be made by a judging panel of SFPQ staff and industry representatives.

The decision by the panel will be final.

The winning recipient will be awarded \$10 000 and must use the financial assistance to further promote their change or improvement in the Industry. Applicants for this award must be aged 18 or over.

Applications are assessed by a judging panel of SFPQ staff and industry representatives.

- How you could use the financial assistance to further promote or develop your change, improvement/ idea or initiative.
